Relatives Visa

All visa applications have to be lodged in person at the mission in Juba, South Sudan by prior appointment only.

In terms of the Immigration Act 2002 (Act 13 of 2002) Section 18 a Relative's Visa may be issued to a foreigner who is a member of the immediate family of a South African citizen or who holds permanent residence in the Republic of South Africa.

The following documentation is required and criteria apply:

- 1. Application form: <u>DHA-1738</u>. Application must be completed and signed in **black ink** only.
- A valid machine readable Passport / Travel Document valid for no less than (30) days after the expiry of the intended visit with three (3) completely blank pages. Machine readable passports which have been manually extended are not accepted for visas and for travel purposes.
- 3. Two photographs.
- A certified copy of your Marriage certificate or in the case of life partners (defacto relationship) a completed affidavit and notaries contract.
- .5. A certified copy of the South African citizen's South African Passport or South African Identity Book or in the case of a permanent resident, their South African Identity Document or passport with permanent residence permit or full South African Birth Certificate (whichever is applicable).
 - 6. Divorce decree (if applicable).
- 7. Proof of legal separation (if applicable).
- 8. Proof of custody where children accompany (if applicable).
- 9. Proof of Adoption (if applicable).
- Consent from parent(s) (if applicable).
- 11. Death certificate in the case of spouse (if applicable).
- Vaccination certificate if traveled through the yellow fever belt of Africa or South America (if applicable).
- 13. Police clearance certificate from the police authorities in each country where the applicant, after having attained the age of 18 years, has resided for 12 months or longer during the 5 years immediately preceding the date of application.
