**OUTSTANDING VAT RETURNS: DIPLOMATIC CORPS** 

As per the Vienna Conventions, the Diplomatic Corps are ordinarily exempt from tax obligations in the receiving state, and so is the case in South Africa. With the option of voluntary registration, there is however a need for adherence to VAT legislation regarding the submission of VAT returns. The Diplomatic Corps are registered for VAT on the payment basis and must submit VAT returns monthly. This means that returns must be submitted whether the Diplomatic Corps claim VAT refunds or not.

There are currently thousands of returns outstanding. SARS issues letters to Foreign Missions to remind that there are some VAT returns from the Diplomatic Corps that have not yet been submitted. It is important that these returns are completed and sent to SARS as soon as possible even if the returns are "NIL" returns, or SARS can deal with the matter from their side.

If Foreign Missions have submitted returns where the expenses are claimed, the process of the VAT refunds will continue as SARS needs to deal with the official expenses incurred by the Diplomatic Corps.

As SARS, we need to ensure that the outstanding returns are collected. Alternatively, we can assist as per our systems to ensure that there are no more letters sent to the Diplomatic Corps.
